Lovely Lace Hat

This hat has a lot of stretch, so even those with larger heads can wear it comfortably.

It's a very easy lace pattern. The lace is only worked on one of four pattern rounds, so it offers good mindless knitting.



Materials

Yarn: 85g/197yds/180m worsted weight yarn.

Shown in Lion Brand "Wool Ease", color cranberry

Needles: 16" circular needle size US 7 (4.5 mm) and set of 5 double-pointed needles size US 7 (4.5 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge.

Notions: Tapestry needle, stitch markers.

Gauge

20 sts and 28 rnds = 4"/10cm over St st unblocked.

Sizes

One Size

Finished Measurements

Unblocked: Circumference 20"/51cm

Stitch Patterns

K1P1 Ribbing

Rnd 1: *K1, P1; rep from * to end of rnd.

Lace Stitch:

Rnd 1: *K3, yo, sl1 k2tog pssso, yo; rep from *.

Rnd 2, 3, 4: Knit all stitches.

Note:

Length may be added if desired by increasing number of rnds worked, being mindful to end after rnd 4

Instructions

With circular needle, cast on 102 sts and join to work in the rnd.

Work in K1P1 Ribbing for approx 2"/5cm.

Knit one round even.

Begin working Lace Stitch. Work lace pattern for approx 44 rnds, ending after patt rnd 4.

Decreases

Rnd 1: *Ssk, K1, yo, sl1 K2tog pssso, yo; rep from *. (85 stitches remain.)

Rnd 2: Knit even.

Rnd 3: *Ssk k3; rep from *. (68 stitches remain.)

Rnd 4: *Ssk; repeat from *. (34 stitches remain.)

Rnd 5: *Ssk; repeat from *. (17 stitches remain.)

Rnd 6: *Ssk; repeat from * to last stitch. K1.

Finishing

Cut yarn leaving approx 8"/20 cm of tail. Thread the tail onto a tapestry needle and draw through the 9 remaining stitches. Pull snug and run the needle through the top of the hat.

Weave in your ends. Enjoy!

Abbreviations list

approx: approximate

dec: decrease

dpn: double pointed needles

inc: increase

k or K: knit

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together

p or P: purl

patt: pattern

pssso: pass slipped stitch over

rem: remain/remaining

rep: repeat

rnd(s): round(s)

sl: slip

sl1k: slip one knit wise

sl1p: slip one purl wise

ssk: Slip 2 sts knitwise one at a time.

Slide the left needle purlwise into both stitches and knit them together as they lie

st(s): stitch(es)

tog: together

yo: yarn over
