



Carré Glace

Carré Glace is inspired by the beautiful ice sculptures to be found in my hometown during the Winterlude celebrations. Paying homage to the architecture of ice castles and the strong influence of our more northern territories, the stitch used in this scarf is an open, arched square that is easily learned. Border stitches echo the body stitches and look best in a soft twist or single ply yarn.

Difficulty: Confident beginner and beyond

SIZE

One size and adjustable

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

As worked in the sample yarn: 6.5" x 6'

MATERIALS

Alpaca and alpaca blends in a bulky / 12 ply weight

Bernat Alpaca Natural Blends was used for the sample scarf and gives a warm and lofty feel without being too heavy should you choose to make the scarf longer.

1 6.00mm crochet hook

TENSION

Is not really important for this project.

In the given yarn and hook suggestions: Three dc = 2.5cm

PATTERN NOTES

There are many great tutorials on the Internet and in books for how to do the single crochet foundation chain. If you want to begin using this method, just choose the one that works best for you.

PATTERN

Chain 24.

If using foundation chain method, work 22 single crochet foundation stitches and then 2ch, turn.

Row 1:

Skip 3 ch (count as 1 dc) 1dc into next chain, *3ch, skip 3ch, 1dc into next 2ch; rep from * to end, turn.

Row 2:

3ch (count as 1dc) skip 1st st, * 5dc into 3ch sp; rep from * ending with 1dc into top of turning ch.

Row3:

3ch (count as 1dc), skip 1st st, 1dc into next dc, *3ch, skip 3dc, 1dc into next 2dc, rep from * to end, turn

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows.

Continue until scarf is the length given or to your personal taste.

If you chose to work the single crochet foundation chain, finish your scarf with a row of sc before casting off.

Tuck in ends, block lightly if desired and enjoy!

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
