

# LATTICE MESH SCARF

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Easy

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Fibers By Tracie



## Description

This scarf is great for stash busting through those skeins of bulky weight yarn (6oz is all you need!) that you have a hard time seeing your stitches in. It utilizes front and back post double crochet stitches. This gives the scarf a thick mesh look which is warm and cushy.

Finished size is 5 in. by 80 in.

## Materials

### Yarn

- 6 oz. bulky weight yarn

### Hook

- L (8.0mm) crochet hook or hook appropriate for yarn and gauge

## Notions

- Scissors
- Tapestry needle

## Gauge

- 9 sts / 5.5 rows in pattern = 4 in.

## Abbreviations

**abbrev.** Abbreviation meaning.

**bpdc** back post double crochet

**ch** chain

**dc** double crochet

**fpdc** front post double crochet

**sc** single crochet

**sl st** slip stitch

**yo** yarn over

\* \* repeat instructions between asterisks as many times as indicated

## Pattern Notes

- Post stitches stay lined up. In other words, once you turn the work, you'll be working bpdc into the previous row's fpdc.

## Special Stitches

- **Front Post Double Crochet:** Yo, insert hook from front to back to front around post of indicated stitch, pull up a loop, (yo, pull yarn through 2 loops on hook) twice.

- **Back Post Double Crochet:** Yo, insert hook from back to front to back around post of indicated stitch, pull up a loop, (yo, pull yarn through 2 loops on hook) twice.

## Scarf

Chain 13

**Row 1:** Dc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across. Turn (11dc).

**Row 2:** Ch 2 (counts as first dc here and throughout), fpdc around next dc from previous row, \* bpdc around next st, fpdc around next st; Rep from \* to last dc, dc in top of turning ch. Turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, bpdc around next st, \* fpdc around next st, bpdc around next st; Rep from \* to last dc, dc in top of turning ch. Turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, fpdc around next st, \* bpdc around next st, fpdc around next st; Rep from \* to last dc, dc in top of turning ch.

Repeat rows 3 and 4 to desired length, ending with row 4. Do not fasten off.

## Finishing

**Edging:** Ch 1, sc evenly around entire scarf, join with sl st to first sc.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.
