

# A POPPY FOR REMEMBRANCE

A poppy is worn by Canadians to remember the sacrifices of war. Donations from this pattern will be sent to the Royal Canadian Legion.

## **Finished Size**

Approximately 2 inches across.

## **Materials**

Scrap red and black yarn - approximately worsted/aran weight  
2.5-2.75 mm double pointed needles, set of 5  
tapestry needle

## **Directions**

CO 4 sts in black yarn.

Round 1: \* kfb, take up an empty needle \* repeat to end. 8 sts.

Round 2: k around.

Round 3: \* kfb, k1 \* repeat to end. 12 sts.

Switch to red yarn.

Round 4: k around.

Round 5: \* kfb, k1, kfb \* repeat to end. 20 sts.

Round 6: k around.

Round 7: \* kfb, k3, kfb \* repeat to end. 28 sts.

Round 8: k around.

Round 9: \* kfb, k2, kfb, k2, kfb\* repeat to end. 40 sts.

Round 10: p around.

Round 11: Bind of all sts pwise.

Cut yarn, leaving long tail. Using the tail to sew, shape the petals by cinching in the fabric at each junction (between increases) to make 4 petals.

Weave in ends.

Attach to left lapel with a safety pin.
