# Double-Quick Boots

...for toasty warm feet



## Size

Foot length: 8 $\frac{3}{4}$  (10, 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ )" / 22 (25.5, 28.5)cm.

Height: 10 (10  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 11)" / 25.5 (26.5, 28)cm.

## Yarn

3 (3, 4) balls aran-bulky weight yarn.  
Sample shown in Bernat Quick 'n Easy (3oz/85g per ball; 100% Acrylic) in Rose.

## Notions

Stitch marker, tapestry needle.

## Needles

8 mm / US 11 24" / 61cm circular needle.

8 mm / US 11 set of 4 or 5 DPN **or** circular 32" / 80cm or longer for [Magic Loop](#) **or** a second circular 24" / 61cm or longer for using [2 circular needle method](#).

## Gauge

*Adjust needle size to obtain the correct gauge.*

**Note: 2 strands of yarn are held as one.**

11 sts and 16 rows = 4" / 10cm with 2 strands of yarn held as one, in Stockinette stitch (ball band gauge is listed as 15 sts and 20 rows = 4" / 10cm on 6mm / US 10 needles).

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## Pattern Notes

These slippers are knit using a double strand of bulky yarn so they truly are a quick knit. The cuff and heel portion is knit flat; work is then joined in the round to work the foot and the toe. The heel and back cuff as well as the front cuff are sewn together once the knitting is finished.

## Abbreviations

BO ..... bind off (cast off)  
 CO ..... cast on  
 dec ..... decrease  
 DPN ..... double pointed needle  
 k ..... knit  
 k2tog ..... knit 2 stitches together  
 p ..... purl  
 pm ..... place stitch marker  
 rep ..... repeat  
 Rnd ..... round  
 RS ..... Right Side (public)  
 st/sts ..... stitch / stitches  
 WS ..... Wrong Side (non-public)

## DIRECTIONS

Make 2.

Directions are written for the smallest size; changes for larger sizes are given in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes.

The heel and cuff of the boot are knit flat; then, the work is joined in the round to work the foot and toe.

**Using 2 strands as one throughout**, with 24" / 61cm circular needle CO 68 (72, 76) sts.

**Row 1 (RS):** (K1, p1) 12 times, k20 (24, 28), \*p1, k1, rep from \*.

**Row 2 (WS):** (P1, k1) 12 times, p20 (24, 28), \*k1, p1, rep from \*.

**Rep** previous two rows 6 (8, 8) more times.

**Rep** Row 1 once more.

**Next Row:** BO 24 sts in pattern, purl to last 24 sts, \*k1, p1, rep from \*.

**Next Row:** BO 24 sts in pattern, knit to end. 20 (24, 28) sts.

**Change** to DPN, long circular or add second circular needle as you join work in the rnd.

**Join** in the round being careful not to twist the work and pm to mark beginning of rnd.

**Knit** 13 (18, 23) rounds or until foot measured from CO edge is 1 ½" shorter than desired length.

## Toe

**Next Rnd (dec):** \*K2, k2tog; rep from \*. 15 (18, 21) sts.

**Next Rnd:** Knit.

**Next Rnd (dec):** \*K1, k2tog; rep from \*. 10 (12, 14) sts.

**Next Rnd:** Knit.

**Next Rnd (dec):** \*K2tog; rep from \*. 5 (6, 7) sts.

**Cut** yarn leaving a 12" / 30cm tail. Pull tail through remaining loops following the direction of knitting (the tapestry needle works well for this); remove needles if you haven't already; bring tail to wrong side of work.

**Fold** the slipper flat, RS together, matching cuff halves. **Sew** up the back heel and cuff seam; sew up the front cuff seam.

## Finishing

**Weave** in all ends. **Block** if desired.
