



iPod Nano Cozy by Jen Hansen <http://knittinglikecrazy.com>

A nice simple iPod Nano Cozy to keep your iPod looking good. If you're like me, the iPod is going everywhere with you and this cozy is a great way to keep it clean and scratch free while being thrown in and out of your purse, your car, your knitting bag, etc.

Finished Measurements: iPod Nano Sized, approximately 3" by 2.5"

Materials

- Approximately 30 yards of leftover sock yarn. (Blue Moon Fiber Arts Socks That Rock Mediumweight is pictured)
- US Size 2 (2.75mm) needles or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry Needle
- Small Button

Gauge: 6.5 stitches/inch in stockinette stitch

Pattern Notes:

Abbreviations:

CO	cast on
k	knit
p	purl

Directions:

CO 17 stitches. Row 1: Slip 1, (k1, p1)* repeat * to end. Repeat this row for 19 more rows (20 rows total)

Switch to stockinette, slipping the first stitch of each row. Continue in stockinette until piece measures 6.25" from cast on edge.

Switch back to Row 1 and repeat for a total of 10 rows. Bind off.

With wrong sides together fold so that bind off edge meets the start of the stockinette portion of cozy. Seam sides. Attach a button of choice to the front of the cozy (about where the stockinette stitch and seed stitch meet. Add a button loop using leftover yarn to the edge of the flap.

Put iPod in its new cozy and enjoy!
