

# Side To Side Self Fringing Scarf

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This super simple scarf is an easy and fast knit. Once you get your head around the large number of stitches, it goes by fairly quickly.

Finished measurements: 5ft long by 3" wide

Materials:

1 skein WW yarn (3" wide)

2 skeins WW yarn (5" wide)

Size 9 circs (I use circs to comfortably hold the larger amount of sts. Scarf is knit back and forth)

Leaving a 4" tail, CO: 200 sts Cut yarn leaving a 4" tail

Leaving a 4" tail, knit to the end, leaving a 4" tail.

You are basically starting and ending every row with 4" hanging out to create the fringe.

After every 6<sup>th</sup> row I knotted three of the tails together, it was easier for me than waiting until the completion of the scarf.

For the scarf pictured above, I thought I had two skeins of this yarn, well, I was wrong. So this one is only 3" wide. It looks really good on the brat, but I think the one I make for myself is going to use two skeins for a 5" wide scarf.

I hope you enjoy this pattern. It's really really easy and you can whip one of these out with one night of television.

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
