



# Knoll Rib Cowl

# Knoll Rib Cowl

*A quick knit for handspun yarn*

## About

### Finished Size:

5½ inches/ 14 cm wide

4½ ft/ 1.4 meters circumference

### Yarn:

200 yds / 183m of Enchanted Knoll Farms Handspun Worsted yarn in Gold Dust Woman; or 200 yards of a worsted to bulky weight handspun yarn

### Gauge:

18 sts and 16 rows = 4" / 10 cm in Pattern

### Needles & Notions:

Size 10.5 US / 6.5 mm straight or circular needles,

Tapestry needle

Scrap yarn



## Pattern

Using a Provisional Cast On, CO 25 sts.

Row 1: \*K1, k2tog and leave on left needle, purl through the same two sts. Repeat from \* until last st, k1.

Row 2: Purl all stitches.

Repeat these two rows, ending on Row 2 when there is slightly more than one row's worth of yarn left, or when cowl reaches approximately 4 to 4½ feet in length.

## Finishing

Transfer the sts from the provisional cast on onto a spare needle.

Using the Kitchener stitch, weave together live sts on each end of scarf to form a loop. Weave in ends with the tapestry needle. Block as desired.

## Abbreviations:

**CO:** cast on

**k2tog:** knit two together

**sts:** stitches
