

## Cookie's pup PDF



*This cute pup is a gift I designed for my mother, Cookie. The pup measures 9 inches tall. Looks ready to play and have fun! Please enjoy making this cute puppy as I had designing and making. With warm regards, PJ.*

### Supplies:

- ☺ 1 skein of Impeccable, True Grey (acrylic) or any medium weight yarn for the head and legs
- ☺ 1 skein of Impeccable, Brown (acrylic) or any small amount of medium weight yarn for nose, ears, and tail
- ☺ 1 skein of Impeccable White (acrylic) or any small amount of medium weight yarn for the eyes
- ☺ 1 skein of Bernat Softee Chunky, Gray Ragg (acrylic) or any medium weight yarn for the body. This particular yarn states bulky weight but works well with the Impeccable yarn from Michael's
- ☺ Size E/ 4 (3.5mm) crochet hook or any size to obtain correct gauge
- ☺ 1 set of 15 mm safety plastic eyes or 1 pr of black buttons.
- ☺ **Optional: black embroidery thread to make a pair of eyes if not using safety eyes)**
- ☺ polyester fiberfill
- ☺ 1 Stitch marker
- ☺ 1 Yarn (weaving needle)

- ☺ Fabric Tac glue
- ☺ Small piece of pink felt for tongue
- ☺ 3/8th width ribbon for collar
- ☺ 1 gem sticker for decorating collar.
- ☺ **Warning: please do not add gem or safety eyes to this project for infants or children 3 yrs or younger as it is a choking hazard!**

Skill level: Easy and fun to make. Gauge is not important.

This pattern has photos and written step-by-step instructions, even

for an adventurous beginner.

Need to know the basic stitches, seen in Abbreviations section.

### Notes:

- ☺ After making numerous dolls, I found that crochet hook E/4 (3.5 mm) makes the tightest stitches.  
However, the basic rule is to work stitches tightly so stuffing does not show.
- ☺ With the type of doll to make, called amigurumi, you will work in the round  
but do not join. I use a stitch marker to indicate the beginning of the next  
row as the work progresses.
- ☺ Refer to the photo tutorial to see the progression of this project.
- ☺ You may use the adjustable ring method to start your rounds.  
I still use ch 2, 6 sc in the second ch to start my beginning rounds.  
There is no right or wrong, mostly, preference.

### Abbreviations:

- ☺ ch: chain stitch
- ☺ sl st: slip stitch
- ☺ inc: 2 single crochet stitches in 1 sc
- ☺ dec: decrease or in this pattern, 2 sc tog is acceptable
- ☺ []: work directions inside brackets as many times as indicated.
- ☺ st(s): stitches

Head: Make 1.

- 1) Ch 2. 9 sc in the 2nd ch st. (9)
- 2) place marker (PM). 2 sc in the next 9 sc. (18)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 9 times. (27)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 9 times. (36)
- 5) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 3 sc] 9 times. (45)
- 6) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (45)
- 7) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (45)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (45)
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (45)
- 10) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (45)
- 11) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (45)
- 12) PM. [Dec or (2sctag), sc in the next 3 sc] 9 times. (36)
- 13) PM. [Dec or (2sctag), sc in the next 2 sc] 9 times. (27)
- 14) PM. [Dec or (2sctag), sc in the next 1 sc] 9 times. (18)

\* Placement of the eyes (using safety eyes, buttons, or even embroidery)

is at this point because it is extremely hard to do after you close the shape

of the head.

I usually place at row 7 at 6 sts apart.

See photo as reference.

Stuffing starts here if you like but I usually wait until I am closer to closing the gap.

- 15) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.

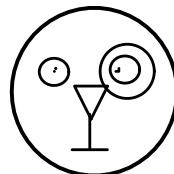
Eye Rings Make 3.

Left eye : using brown yarn as the underlying brown patch.

- 1) Ch 2. 6 sc in the 2nd ch. (6)
- 2) PM. [2 sc in the next sc] 6 times. (12)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc and 1 sc in the next sc] 6 times. (18)
- 4) PM. 1 sc in the next sc around.
- 5) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.

Left eye : using white yarn.

- 1) Ch2. 6 sc in the 2nd ch. (6)
- 2) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.



Right eye: using white yarn.

- 1) Ch 2, 6 sc in the 2nd ch. (6)
- 2) PM. [2 sc in the next sc] 6 times. (12)
- 3) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.

- \* Plan: to sew eye ring to right and left side where eye will be centered with safety eyes or embroidered in place.
- \* In this pattern, the placement of each eye is off center for a confused look.
- \* Follow photos as reference.
- \* No apologies for my drawing skills.

Nose: Make 1.

- 1) Ch 2, 2 sc in the 2nd ch. Ch 1 and turn. (2)
- 2) 2 sc in 1 sc, 1 sc in the next sc. Ch 1 and turn. (3)
- 3) 2 sc in 1 sc, 1 sc in the next 2 sc. Ch 1 and turn. (4)
- 4) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.

Ears: Make 2.

- 1) Ch 2, 6 sc in the 2nd ch st. (6)
- 2) Place marker (PM). 2 sc in the next 6 sc. (12)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 6 times. (24)
- 5) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (24)
- 6) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), sc in the next 2 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 7) PM. [Dec or (2sc tog), 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (12)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 10) PM. [2 sc in the next sc] 6 times. (6)
- 11) Fasten off and leave a long tail for weaving.

- \* Do Not stuff ears.
- Plan: Placement of the ears:
- Follow the photos for placement as reference.

4 Paws /legs and 1 body

- 1) Ch 2, 6 sc in the 2nd ch st. (6)
- 2) PM. 2 sc in the next 6 sc. (12)

- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (18)
- 4) PM. [Dec or (2.sctog), 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (12)
- 5) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 6) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 7) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 10) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 11) PM. Sc in the next sc around. (12)
- 12) Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.
- 13) Stuff carefully.

Body: Make 1.

- 1) Ch 2. 8 sc in the 2nd ch st. (8)
- 2) PM. 2 sc in the next 8 sc. (16)
- 3) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 8 times. (24)
- 4) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 2 sc in the next 1 sc] 8 times. (32)
- 5) PM. [2 sc in the next sc, 3 sc in the next 1 sc] 8 times. (40)
- 6) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 7) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 8) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 9) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 10) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 11) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 12) PM. Sc in the next sc. (40)
- 13) PM. [Dec or (2.sctog), 1 sc in the next 3 sc] 8 times. (32)
- 14) PM. Sc in the next sc. (32)
- 15) PM. Sc in the next sc. (32)
- 16) PM. [Dec or (2.sctog), 1 sc in the next 2 sc] 8 times. (24)
- 17) PM. Sc in the next sc. (24)
- 18) PM. Sc in the next sc. (24)
- 19) PM. [Dec or (2.sctog), 1 sc in the next 1 sc] 6 times. (16)
- 20) PM. [2 sc in the next sc] 8 times. (8)
- 21) PM. Sc in the next sc. (8)
- 22) Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

\* Start stuffing body with polyester fiberfill at this time.

Tail: Make 1.

- 1) Ch 2, 3 sc in the 2nd ch st. (3)
- 2) PM, 2 sc in the next 3 sc. (6)
- 3) PM, Sc in the next sc. (6)
- 4) PM, Sc in the next sc. (6)
- 5) PM, Sc in the next sc. (6)
- 6) PM, Sc in the next sc. (6)
- 7) Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

Assembly and Embellishment

- ❖ The eyes and nose placement should be placed and sewn before stuffing.
- ❖ Connect the ears to the side of the head.
- ❖ Add the legs to the body.
- ❖ Add the body to the head.
- ❖ Cut a small piece of pink felt in the shape of a tongue and glue to side of mouth.

I used Fabric-Tac to adhere but you can stitch on, too.

- ❖ Add ribbon and tie a knot or make a bow to the neck as a collar.
- ❖ Optional: Add a gem to the knot for embellishment.
