

REFUGE HAT

Perfect for donation, the Refuge Hat uses HDC throughout to create a thick and comfy texture that will keep your head warm in any conditions.

Make it in wool or acrylic, cotton or blends, and donate it to every place that accepts hats!

YARN:

Approx 140 yds worsted weight yarn.

I have used Vanna's Choice, Hobby Lobby I Love This Yarn, Lion Brand Fishermen's Wool (pictured), Cascade 220, Caron Simply Soft, and more!

HOOK:

Size US I / 5.5mm hook

NOTIONS:

Darning needle

GAUGE:

3 HDC x 3 HDC = 1"

SIZES:

18" unstretched - fits most teens/adults

ABBREVIATIONS:

BPDC = back post double crochet

CH = chain

FPDC = front post double crochet

HDC = half double crochet

RND = round

SL = slip

ST(S) = stitch(es)

NOTES:

Instructions are given in US crochet terminology.

CH stitches at the beginning of each round count as the first HDC.

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DIRECTIONS:

RND 1: CH4, sl st to form a ring. CH 2, 9
HDC in ring. Sl st to join. (10 st)

RND 2: CH2, HDC in first st. 2HDC in each
st. Sl st to join. (20 st)

RND 3: CH2, HDC in first st. HDC in second
st. (2 HDC in first st, 1 HDC in second st)
around. Sl st to join. (30 st)

RND 4: CH2, HDC in first st. HDC in next 2
sts. (2 HDC in first st, 1 HDC in next 2 st)
around. Sl st to join. (40 st)

RND 5: CH2, HDC in first st. HDC in next 3
sts. (2 HDC in first st, 1 HDC in next 3 st)
around. Sl st to join. (50 st)

RND 6: CH2, HDC in first st. HDC in next 4
sts. (2 HDC in first st, 1 HDC in next 4 st)
around. Sl st to join. (60 st)

RND 7: CH2, HDC in 2nd st. HDC in each st
around. Sl st to join. (60 st)

RND 8-18: repeat RND 7.

BRIM:

RND 19: CH 3. (FPDC in first st, BPDC in
second st) around. Sl st to join. (60 st)

RND 20-22: Repeat RND 19.



FINISHING:

Weave in all ends.
