

# Lumière Midi Scarf

Knit on the bias with an eyelet border, this mid-length scarf can be worn in multiple stylish ways. I was looking for something classy but a little rustic & funky for a small skein of handspun yarn. I was well into knitting this scarf when, thanks to *Cecil B. Demented*, I realized how the eyelet border reminded me of perforations on movie film.

This scarf can be worn in many ways, especially with the use of a shawl pin.

## Skill Level

Easy

## Finished Measurements

3.5" (9 cm) wide, 42" (107 cm) long.

## Yarn

84 yards (77m) light worsted handspun Merino wool .

## Needles & Hook

Size US 7 (4.5mm) needles.

Size US G (4.5 mm) crochet hook.

## Notions

Tapestry needle

## Gauge

10 sts per 2" (5cm), 14 rows per 2" (5cm).

Exact gauge is not important, so feel free to experiment with different yarn weights and needles.

## Abbreviations

CO- cast on

K- knit

P-purl

K2tog- knit 2 together

YO- yarn over

BO- bind off



## Directions

### Setup-

CO 19 sts using long tail method.

(WS): K2, p to last 3 sts, k3 .

(RS): K2tog, yo, k2tog, [yo, k2tog] to last st, yo, k1.

### Scarf Body-

Row 1 (WS): K2, p to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 2 (RS): K2tog, yo, k2tog, k to last st, yo, k1.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until work measures 42" or until a small amount of yarn remains.

### End-

(WS): K2, p to last 3 sts, k3.

(RS): K2tog, yo, k2tog, [yo, k2tog] to last st, yo, k1.

(WS): K2, p to last 2 sts, p2.

BO.

## Finishing

Work 2 rows of single crochet on CO and BO edges.

Weave in ends and block scarf to straighten and open up eyelet edgings.
