

Child's Earflap Hat Crochet Pattern



Size Chart	Size 1	Size 2
Approximate Age	Newborn-12 months	12 – 24 Months
Approximate Circumference	36.20 cm (14 ¼")	44.45 cm (17 ½")

Size Notes

Sizes are approximate and will be affected by the gauge, choice of yarn, and the amount of stretch in the yarn. As every child is different, we recommend measuring the child's head to guarantee fit.

Materials

2 Balls of Bernat® Bamboo Natural Blends (89% Bamboo, 11% Acrylic) 60 g/ 2.1 oz for hat
 1/3 Ball of Bernat® Bamboo Natural Blends (89% Bamboo, 11% Acrylic) 60 g/ 2.1 oz for edging and flower
 Colours shown – Dill, Rosehip, and Linen
 6.50 mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
 Yarn needle
 2 Buttons

Gauge

4 Rounds = 5 cm (2") diameter with a 6.50 mm crochet hook

Stitch Legend

ch – chain
 hdc – half double crochet
 sc - single crochet
 sk - skip
 sc2tog – single crochet 2 together = (insert hook in next stitch, yo, pull through a loop) twice, yo, pull through all 3 loops on hook
 sl st – slip stitch
 sp - space
 st - stitch
 yo – yarn over

Colour A – Dill or Rosehip; **Colour B** – Linen

Option A – Button Strap; **Option B** – Loose Earflaps

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Pattern is written for Size 1, with Size 2 in parentheses.

Instructions for Hat

With a 6.50 mm crochet hook, ch 4. Sl st into first ch to form a ring.

Round 1: Sc 5 (6) into ring.

Round 2: 2 sc in first sc and in each sc around – 10(12) sc

Round 3: 2 sc in first sc and in each sc around – 20(24) sc.

Round 4: 1 sc in first sc and in each sc around – 20(24) sc.

Round 5: *1 sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat from * around – 30(36) sc.

Rounds 6 – 7: 1 sc in first sc and in each sc around – 30(36) sc.

Round 8: *1 sc in each of the next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat from * around – 40(48) sc.

Round 9 – 10: 1 sc in first sc and in each sc around – 40(48) sc.

Round 11: *1 sc in each of the next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat from * around – 50(60) sc.

Rounds 12 – 22(24): 1 sc in first sc and in each sc around – 50(60) sc. In the last sc on your last round, sl st, ch 1, turn. **Do not fasten off.**

****Note**** - add or decrease the amount of rounds to attain the desired depth of the hat.

Neck

Row 1: sc2tog (in sl st and last sc on last round), 1 sc in next sc and in next 31(37) sc, ch 1, turn – 33(39) sc.

Row 2: sc2tog, 1 sc in next sc and in next 28(34), sc2tog, ch 1, turn – 31(37) sc.

Do not fasten off.

****For Size 1, proceed to Row 5****

Size 2 only

Row 3: 1 sc in first sc and in each sc around, ch 1, turn – 37 sc.

Row 4: sc2tog, 1 sc in next sc and in next 32 sc, sc2tog, ch 1, turn – 35 sc.

Do not fasten off.

Right Earflap-Both Options

Row 5: 1 sc in first sc and in next 12(14) sc, 1 sl st in each of next 2 sc, turn – 15(17) st.

Row 6: sk over 2 sl st on previous round, 1 sc in first sc and in next 10(12) sc, sc2tog, ch 1, turn – 12(14) sc.

Row 7: 1 sc in first sc and in next 8(10) sc, 1 sl st in each of the next 2 sc, turn – 11(13) st.

Row 8: sk over 2 sl st on previous round, 1 sc in first sc and in next 6(8) sc, sc2tog, ch 1, turn – 8(10) sc.

Row 9: 1 sc in first sc and in next 4(6) sc, 1 sl st in each of next 2 sc, turn – 7(9) st.

For Option A – Buttoned Earflap – Size 1 & 2

Row 10: sk over 2 sl st on previous round, 1 sc in first sc and in next 4(6) sc, ch 1, turn – 5(7) sc.

Rows 11 – 20: 1 sc in first sc and in each sc to end, ch 1, turn – 5(7) sc.

Row 21: 1 sc in first 2(3) sc, ch 2, sk 1 sc, 1 sc in each of the last 2(3) sc, ch 1, turn – 6(8) st.

Row 22: 1 sc in first 2(3) sc, 1 sc in ch 2 space, 1 sc in each of last 2(3) sc, ch 1, turn – 5(7) sc.

Row 23: 1 sc in first sc and in each sc to end – 5(7) sc.

Row 24: repeat row 21 – 6(8) st.

Row 25: repeat Row 22 – 5(7) sc.

Row 26: repeat Row 23 – 5(7) sc.

Row 27: repeat Row 21 – 6(8) st.

Row 28: 1 sl st in first sc, 1(2) sc, 1 hdc in ch 2 space, 1(2) sc, 1 sl st in last sc – 5(7) st.

Fasten off and weave in end.

****Note**** - instructions make 3 button holes and by only attaching 2 buttons to the opposite earflap, you will have a slightly adjustable strap but you can add rows between Row 11 and 20 if you desire a longer strap.

For Option B – Loose Earflap – Size 1 only

Row 10: sk over 2 sl st on previous round, 1 sc in first sc, ch 2, sk over 2 sc, sc2tog, ch 1, turn – 4 st.

Row 11: sk first sc, 3 sc in ch 2 sp, sl st in last sc – 4 st.

Fasten off and weave in end.

For Option B – Loose Earflap – Size 2 only

Row 10: sk over 2 sl st on previous round, 1 sc in first 2 sc, ch 2, sk over 2 sc, 1 sc in next sc, sc2tog, ch 1, turn – 6 st.

Row 11: sl st in first sc, 1 sc, 2 hdc in ch 2 sp, 1 sc in next sc, sl st in last sc – 6 st.

Fasten off and weave in end.

Left Earflap-Both Options

Row 5: With outside of hat facing you and starting at the front of the earflap, sl st in first sc, ch 1 (doesn't count as sc), 1 sc in same st as sl st and in next 12(14) sc, 1 sl st in next 2 sc, turn – 15(17) st.

Repeat instructions for **Row 6 – 20** and **Row 28** for Option A – Buttoned Earflap (creates a shorter strap)
Or

Repeat instructions for **Row 6 – 11** for Option B – Loose Earflap

Fasten off and weave in end.

Edging

In back center sc, join Colour B with a sl st, ch 1 (doesn't count as a sc), 1 sc in same st as sl st and around the entire outer edge of hat. Join edging with a sl st in ch 1 at beginning of round. Fasten off and weave in end.

Ties (make 2)

Holding one strand each of Colour A and B, ch 60. Fasten off. Thread through earflap hole, tie ends together and trim tassles.

Flower (optional)

With a 6.50 mm crochet hook and colour B, ch 5. Sl st into first ch to form a ring.

Round 1: Sc 10 into ring – 10 sc.

Petal 1: sl st in front loop only of first sc, ch 10, sl st in back loop only of same sc.

Petal 2: sl st in front loop only of next sc, ch 10, sl st in back loop only of same sc.

Petals 3 – 10: repeat instructions for petal 2.

Fasten off leaving a long end.

Using a yarn needle and loose ends, attach flower to left temple of hat.

Buttons – Option B

Attach 2 buttons to left strap, spaced appropriately to align with buttonholes on right strap.
